Topic: Plants	Science	Computing
Our topic this half-term is 'Plants'. This curriculum newsletter provides an overview of your child's learning during the remaining weeks of the summer term.	As scientists we will: Observe and compare plants. We will learn what the different parts of a plant are called, where we might find wild and garen plants and naming some common plants. Our science lessons will also consist of two trips to the outdoor classroom.	As coders we will: Learn how to login and use a keyboard. We will then move on to writing on a word document and programming animations.
English	PE	RE
As writers we will: Explore the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We will be learning how to describe the different characters and setting before embarking on writing our very own version of the story. We will be continuing our focus on full stops and capital letters whilst also looking at sequencing a story with a beginning, middle and end. As readers we will: Continue to learn new sounds and practise reading them with our reading books. We will also be focusing on using our 'storyteller voice' to make our reading more exciting. We will also have the opportunity to read our own story aloud to other children.	As athletes we will: Get ready for sports morning by practising the different activities and then applying the cricket skills we learnt last half term.	As theologists we will: Reflect on what we have learnt over the last year and think about what it means to us individually.
